1. **(ID # 11739) Act – BOND ACT-BPS23-Vehicle Acquisition & Replacement:**

A BOND ACT authorizing the issuance of ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED SIXTEEN THOUSAND (\$1,516,000) DOLLARS in bonds of Westchester County to finance Capital Project BPS23 - Vehicle Acquisition and Replacement.

Joint with B&A and Public Safety

Guests: Commissioner Gleason, Chief Inspector McGlynn, Lieutenant McGuinness and Sargent O'Connor, Department of Public Safety and First Deputy Commissioner, Bud Nicoletti, Department of Public Works & Transportation

Commissioner Gleason, Chief Inspector McGlynn, Lieutenant McGuinness and Sargent O'Connor from the Department of Public Safety joined Deputy Commissioner Nicoletti from the Department of Public Works & Transportation and Larry Soule, Budget Director, to discuss item # 11739- Bond Act - BPS23 - Vehicle Acquisition & Replacement.

Commissioner Gleason informed the Committees that this is Bond Act that will fund the replacement of various equipment and vehicles for the Department of Public Safety for \$1,516,000. The Commissioner noted that the Department will acquire (25) patrol vehicles for \$963,600, (5) replacement unmarked vehicle for \$182,325, (2) canine vehicles for \$85,086 and accessories including (8) in-car computer/video system and other related equipment for \$284,989. The costs factor in the reduction that was made possible by the Shared Service agreement with Nassau and Suffolk Counties (which potentially enables the purchase of more vehicles for the same budget amount). The Commissioner stated that there are (40) vehicles that have an excess of 100,000 miles, which represents about 10% of the entire fleet (approximately 250 vehicles including motorcycles and specialized trucks). Discussion was held on the types of vehicles to be purchased, the use of hybrid vehicles and canine vehicles (for dogs trained in narcotics and bomb detection). The Commissioner stated that the Department is looking at hybrid cars, which in older versions weren't large enough to hold all the necessary equipment. They will be test driving cars to determine if they will fit the needs of the Department. While there is a \$3000.00 additional cost for hybrids, the mileage per gallon is considerably better and in the long run, will offset the cost as well as help the environment. In response to Legislator Cunzio's question, he stated that there are 12 canine vehicles and the problem that occurred in the past has been corrected. There was some discussion about cars that are in usable condition to be made available for small municipalities that may not have resources to buy new vehicles. Conditioned on supply of cost breakdown for equipment and conditions' ratings, with a motion by Legislator Barr and seconded by Legislator Covill the item was approved with a vote of 6-0.

2. (ID # 11738) Act – BOND ACT-BLR2D-Labs & Research Equipment Acq. '16-'20:

A BOND ACT authorizing the issuance of EIGHT HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND (\$850,000) DOLLARS in bonds of Westchester County to finance Capital Project BLR2D - Labs and Research Equipment Acquisition (2016-2020).

Joint with B&A and EH&E

Deputy Medical Examiner Milovanovic and Peggy Schmidt from the Department of Labs & Research and Budget Director Soule came before the Committee to discuss item #11738- Bond Act BLR2D- Labs & Research Equipment Acquisition. This is capital project for \$850,000 in order to fund the replacement of equipment for the Department of Labs & Research's public health, forensic science, toxicology, environmental and medical examiners labs. The equipment will include; Environmental, 2 SPE Extractor - \$115,000; Skylar Auto analyzer - \$95,000; Spectrophotometer- \$25,000; Acid Washing Device - \$15,000; Forensic, Gas Chromatograph/ Mass Spectrometers -\$170,000; Microbiology, Solana Instrument- \$15,000; Automated Identification system- \$50,000; BD Bactec FX40 Instrument- \$40,000; Toxicology, Q Trap- \$275,000; Building, Oil-less Compressor System- \$50,000. The Department advised that this equipment is necessary for the continued health and safety of Westchester residents. Chair Borgia and Chair Shimsky of the Public

Works Committee asked the Department and the Budget director to amend the Bond Act to include the specific instruments. The item was held over until the next joint meeting so the Department can amend the Bond Act. No action was taken.

- (ID # 11737) Act – Non-Exclusive Permanent Easement-City of New York:**

AN ACT authorizing the County of Westchester to grant a non-exclusive permanent easement to the City of New York, acting through the NYC Department of Environmental Protection, through and across 0.022 acres of County Parcel in the Village of Pleasantville for purposes of ingress and egress to and from the Catskill Aqueduct.

An Act authorizing the County of Westchester to grant a non-exclusive permanent easement to the City of New York, acting through the New York City Department of Environmental Protection (DEF), for approximately 0.022 acres of a County parcel located in the Village of Pleasantville, designated as section, block and lot no. 99.14-1-14 for purposes of maintaining, repairing and monitoring at its sole cost and expense, the portion of the access road over the City Easement Area for vehicular and pedestrian ingress and egress to and from the Catskill Aqueduct which is part of the NYC Water Supply System

Commissioner O'Connor, David DeLuca and Rachel Noe began the meeting by stating that the property was originally supplied by the Parks commission for the creation of the Saw Mill River Pkwy. It is land-locked and has never been used. It will provide access to service for the adjacent property and will

provide help to the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), allowing access to service equipment off Washington Street. It is a very small parcel. Rachel Noe stated that the city has a small easement and wants to expand it. The adjoining parcel is City land. The purpose is to create an access road off Washington, swinging around to City property and onto a small portion of County land connecting to the City easement and a bridge. There are tunnels that are part of the Catskill Aqueduct with very old valves to the tunnels that have seized and they need access to repair them. Their purpose is to open and close the aqueducts so they can de-water the tunnels and to complete rehabilitation work on them for the water supply system. A County run sewer runs through the property and onto City property which is maintained by the County DEF. The City will provide a reciprocal easement for access to the trunk sewer. It is considered a "win-win" scenario. The Parks Board made requests which the City has agreed to incur; including no excessive noise to disturb residents in the area. The SEQRA is a coordinated full service review. The licensing agreement is temporary and it will provide "no trespassing" signage. Approvals are discretionary and can be easily cancelled. It allows for access to the road and provides for staging areas. It is subject to the permanent easement. The work is expected to be complete by the end of April. The City must maintain the property but is not required to plow in winter. If the County wants to use it in winter, it is responsible for clearing the snow. Legislator Shimsky inquired whether the road is going to be paved or gravel. Ms. Noe will advise. The new roadway will only be for "incidental use" so won't be used very often. It will be beneficial to the county as the manholes will be easily accessible for access to the trunk line for servicing according to Mr. DeLucia. There was no easy access before. Legislator Shimsky asked if the City will protect the trunk line during construction. Ms. Noe noted that the plans were signed off by the DEF and they didn't foresee any problem. The agreement calls out for the City to do the repairs if there are any damages. Mr. DeLucia said that the City is not grading near the trunk line so there is no need to dig. Ms. Noe stated that permits from the County Department of Public Works (DPW) are required because it is on a county road and approved by the Commissioner of Parks so approvals are built in. Contractors can't work until they have submitted proof of insurance signed off by Risk Management. Legislator Shimsky asked if this parcel has park status. Mr. DeLucia said it was purchased for parkways and parks in the 1920's but never used, or even open for public use and only used for construction purposes. It was asserted that no state alienation legislation is required by Ms. Noe. Another question asked was if there is a history of sewage overflow from the sewer of manholes. The response is that the DEF would know and if the issue existed, it would have come up in the review and if there is a history of flooding. Mr. DeLuca said that the DEC would know. He noted that it is very steep and likely no impact on homes. The newly constructed access could actually be helpful for access to the river and the bridge if there is some debris buildup that must be cleared. The SEQRA is for the permanent easement and the temporary easement. Chris Crane found a typo in the citation of the bloc and lot number in both the Committee report and the County Executive's cover letter which will be corrected. Questions will be sent to Ms. Noe who will Send DEF questions and SEQRA review and history of flooding. A map of the affected area can be accessed in the "full minutes".

With a motion by Legislator Barr and seconded by Legislator Parker, the item was approved with a vote of 3-0.

Transmitted herewith for your review and approval is a bond act (the “Bond Act”), which if adopted, would authorize the County of Westchester (the “County”) to issue up to \$850,000 in bonds of the County to finance the following capital project:

BLR2D - Labs and Research Equipment Acquisition (2016-2020) (“BLR2D”).

This project funds the acquisition of new and replacement equipment for the Department of Labs and Research’s (the “Department”) public health, forensic science, toxicology, environmental and medical examiner labs. The Department must use complex, high-tech new and replacement instrumentation in order to carry out its required activities and maintain a state of the art laboratory facility. This instrumentation is necessary for the continued health and safety of Westchester County residents.

The current bonding request will finance the cost of the acquisition of various lab equipment, such as Vitek compact 15 Instrument, compressor, Gas Chromatograph/Mass Spectrometer, and Auto Analyzer. It is expected that the Department will purchase the equipment within eighteen to twenty-four months after bonding authorization.

It should be noted that your Honorable Board has previously authorized bonding in connection with prior components of BLR2D as indicated in the annexed fact sheet.

The Planning Department has advised that, based on its review, the above referenced capital project is classified as a “Type II” action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (“SEQR”). Therefore, no further environmental review is required for this project. As you know, your Honorable Board may use such expert advice to reach its own conclusion.

As this Honorable Board knows, the Department must use complex, high-tech new and replacement instrumentation in order to carry out its required activities and maintain a state of the art laboratory facility. This instrumentation is necessary for the continued health and safety of Westchester County residents.

The Department has advised that the Bond Act, prepared by the law firm of Hawkins Delafield & Wood, LLP, will finance the cost of the acquisition of various lab equipment, such as Vitek compact 15 Instrument, compressor, Gas Chromatograph/Mass Spectrometer, and Auto Analyzer. The Department has advised your Committee that it expects to purchase the equipment within eighteen to twenty-four months after bonding authorization.

It should be noted that this Honorable Board has previously authorized bonding in connection with prior components of BLR2D as indicated in the annexed fact sheet.

The Planning Department has advised that, based on its review, the above capital project is a “Type II” action under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (“SEQR”), and its implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617, which is an action determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and therefore does not require further environmental review. Your Committee has reviewed the annexed SEQR documentation prepared by the Planning Department and concurs with this conclusion.

It should be noted that an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of your Honorable Board is required in order to adopt the Bond Act. Your Committee recommends the adoption of the proposed Bond Act.

ACT NO. -20____

BOND ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$850,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, OR SO MUCH THEREOF AS MAY BE NECESSARY, TO FINANCE THE COST OF THE ACQUISITION OF LAB EQUIPMENT FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF LABS AND RESEARCH, STATING THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$850,000; STATING THE PLAN OF FINANCING SAID COST INCLUDES THE ISSUANCE OF \$850,000 BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED; AND PROVIDING FOR A TAX TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS. (Adopted _____, 20____)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the voting strength of said Board), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law"), the Westchester County Administrative Code, being Chapter 852 of the Laws of 1948, as amended, and to the provisions of other laws applicable thereto, \$850,000 bonds of the County, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby authorized to be issued to finance the cost of the acquisition of various lab equipment, such as Vitek compact 15 Instrument, compressor, Gas Chromatograph/Mass Spectrometer, and Auto Analyzer, all as set forth in the County's Current Year Capital Budget, as amended. To the extent that the details set forth in this act are inconsistent with any details set forth in the Current Year Capital Budget of the County, such Budget shall be deemed and is hereby amended. The total estimated cost of said class of objects or purposes, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof is \$850,000. The plan of financing includes

the issuance of \$850,000 bonds herein authorized, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds, and the levy of a tax to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds.

Section 2. The period of probable usefulness of said objects or purposes, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 89 of the Law, is five (5) years.

Section 3. Current funds are not required to be provided as a down payment pursuant to Section 107.00 d. 9. of the Law prior to issuance of the bonds authorized herein, or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds. The County intends to finance, on an interim basis, the costs or a portion of the costs of said improvements for which bonds are herein authorized, which costs are reasonably expected to be reimbursed with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the County, pursuant to this Act, in the maximum amount of \$850,000. This Act is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 4. The estimate of \$850,000 as the estimated total cost of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is hereby approved, and as the amount of bonds herein authorized is not in excess of \$10,000,000, this Act is not subject to referendum.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this Act and of the Law, and pursuant to the provisions of §30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and of §§50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of said Law, the powers and duties of the County Board of Legislators relative to authorizing the issuance of any notes in anticipation of the sale of the bonds herein authorized, or the renewals thereof, relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, relative to prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the respective amounts of bonds herein authorized, and

of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and relative to executing agreements for credit enhancement, are hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance of the County, as the chief fiscal officer of the County.

Section 6. Each of the bonds authorized by this Act and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale thereof shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by §52.00 of said Local Finance Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the County of Westchester, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and provision shall be made annually in the budgets of the County by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the notes and bonds to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 7. The validity of the bonds authorized by this Act and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

(a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the County is not authorized to expend money, or

(b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this Act or a summary hereof, are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 8. This Act shall take effect in accordance with Section 107.71 of the Westchester County Charter
