

**HONORABLE BOARD OF LEGISLATORS  
THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK**

Your Committee is in receipt of a transmittal from the County Executive recommending approval of a bond act (the “Bond Act”) in the amount of \$275,000 for capital project RB191 – Union Avenue, C.R. 94, Harrison (“RB191”).

Your Committee is informed that the Bond Act, prepared by the law firm of Hawkins Delafield & Wood, LLP, will fund design, construction management and construction associated with the rehabilitation of approximately 0.14 miles of roadway from 2,005 feet east of Mamaroneck Avenue to West Street. Work will include: milling; resurfacing; concrete curb replacement; drainage repairs; new traffic loops; new pavement markings and related work.

The Department of Public Works & Transportation (the “Department”) has advised that this road, which has an annual average daily traffic count (“AADT”) of 5,622, is in need of rehabilitation to provide a safe roadway for the traveling public. The associated pavement condition index rating (“PCI”) in 2016 was 54 and the roadway has continued to deteriorate. The PCI is a pavement condition rating with a range of 0 to 100, with 0 signifying that the road requires reconstruction and 100 signifying that the road is new. Based on this rating this road requires corrective rehabilitation to extend the life of the roadway.

Upon bonding authorization, design will be scheduled and is anticipated to take six (6) months to complete. It is estimated that construction will take six (6) months to complete and will begin after award and execution of construction contracts. The design work is being completed using in-house staff.

The Planning Department has advised your Committee that based on its review, the above referenced capital project has been classified as a Type “II” action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (“SEQRA”) and its implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617. Therefore, no further environmental review is required. Your Committee has reviewed the annexed SEQRA documentation and concurs with this conclusion.

Your Committee is advised that an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of this Honorable Board is required in order to adopt the Bond Act.

Please note that the effective date of the Bond Act will not be before January 2, 2019 and shall be subject to Section 107.71 of the Westchester County Charter.

Your Committee has carefully considered the proposed Bond Act and most respectfully recommends approval of same.

ACT NO. - 20\_\_

BOND ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$275,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, OR SO MUCH THEREOF AS MAY BE NECESSARY, TO FINANCE THE COST OF ROADWAY REHABILITATION OF UNION AVENUE (CR 94), IN THE TOWN OF HARRISON; STATING THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$275,000; STATING THE PLAN OF FINANCING SAID COST INCLUDES THE ISSUANCE OF \$275,000 BONDS HEREIN AUTHORIZED; AND PROVIDING FOR A TAX TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS. (Adopted , 20\_\_)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF LEGISLATORS OF THE COUNTY OF WESTCHESTER, NEW YORK (by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the voting strength of said Board), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law"), the Westchester County Administrative Code, being Chapter 852 of the Laws of 1948, as amended, and to the provisions of other laws applicable thereto, \$275,000 bonds of the County, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby authorized to be issued to finance the design, construction management and construction for the rehabilitation of approximately 0.14 miles of Union Avenue (CR 94) from 2,005 feet east of Mamaroneck Avenue to West Street including milling; resurfacing; concrete curb replacement; drainage improvements; new traffic loops; new pavement markings and related work; all as set forth in the County's 2019 Capital Budget, as amended. To the extent that the details set forth in this act are inconsistent with any details set forth in the 2019 Capital Budget of the County, such Budget shall be deemed and is hereby amended. The estimated maximum cost

of said specific object or purpose, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof is \$275,000. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$275,000 bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds, and the levy of a tax to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds.

Section 2. The period of probable usefulness of said specific object or purpose, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 20(c) of the Law, is fifteen (15) years.

Section 3. Current funds are not required to be provided as a down payment pursuant to Section 107.00 d. 9. of the Law prior to issuance of the bonds authorized herein, or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds. The County intends to finance, on an interim basis, the costs or a portion of the costs of said improvements for which bonds are herein authorized, which costs are reasonably expected to be reimbursed with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the County, pursuant to this Act, in the maximum amount of \$275,000. This Act is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 4. The estimate of \$275,000 as the estimated total cost of the aforesaid object or purpose is hereby approved, and as the amount of bonds herein authorized is not in excess of \$10,000,000, this Act is not subject to referendum.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this Act and of the Law, and pursuant to the provisions of §30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and of §§50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of said Law, the powers and duties of the County Board of Legislators relative to authorizing the issuance of any notes in anticipation of the sale of the bonds herein authorized, or the renewals thereof, relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, relative to prescribing the terms, form and

contents and as to the sale and issuance of the respective amounts of bonds herein authorized, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and relative to executing agreements for credit enhancement, are hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance of the County, as the chief fiscal officer of the County.

Section 6. Each of the bonds authorized by this Act and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale thereof shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by §52.00 of said Local Finance Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the County of Westchester, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the County. The faith and credit of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, and provision shall be made annually in the budgets of the County by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the notes and bonds to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 7. The validity of the bonds authorized by this Act and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

(a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the County is not authorized to expend money, or

(b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this Act or a summary hereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 8. This Act shall take effect on January 2, 2019 and in accordance with Section 107.71 of the Westchester County Charter.
